We also talked about the decline in the use of CDs, and had a video on streaming music services. We talked of the use of the built-in program Migration Assistant to move everything from one computer to another — for instance when replacing an old machine with a newer one.

We looked at drag and drop tricks, keyboard shortcuts, and at a (non MacMost Gary) video on 10 clever tricks that are not widely known...including renaming and number as series of photos, how to move a background window without it automatically moving to the front (hold down the C ommand key as you move the background window), use of the split screen, select a word and click Command D for dictionary and lots of other information, remote desktop sharing, quicker access to files and applications in the Finder, and lots more.
